As always, the event raises funds for scholarships for students interested in pursuing a career in commercial real estate. All the casino games (think: Blackjack) people love will return. But new this year are interactive games such as skeeball, Pop-A-Shot, air hockey, Jenga® Giant[™] and more.

It's all designed to increase attendance – and giving. This year's fundraising goal is \$20,000. CREW leaders hope to raise that at two fundraisers – Casino and Gaming Night in March and the ABC Networking event in September.

"By CREW Charlotte offering financial assistance in the form of scholarships to students – especially women pursuing this field – we are helping groom our next wave of the most empowered, influential thought leaders in the commercial real estate space," said Elizabeth Romano, program manager at Wood, plc and – along with Megan Shaw, a CPA at CohnReznick – Casino and Gaming Night co-chair.

Nikki McLucas is a past CREW Network scholarship recipient. As part of her \$5,000 scholarship, she received a one-year paid CREW Charlotte membership, a paid internship at CBRE and complimentary admission to the CREW Network convention. She was a student member of CREW Charlotte for three years before joining the organization as a working professional. After earning a master's degree in accounting last August, McLucas is a member of the tax accounting staff at Elliott Davis, where she prepares returns for real estate clients.

"During the three years I was a student member, I attended conventions in Miami, New York City and Houston where I engaged with local and national members and received industry training and insight," McLucas said. Thanks to CREW, she was able to begin cultivating her own professional network while still a student.

Event proceeds support local scholarships for students at the undergraduate and graduate level pursuing a career in commercial real estate at the UNC Charlotte Center for Real Estate and Queens University of Charlotte. CREW Charlotte gives additional money to the CREW Network Foundation, and that organization awards multiple scholarships annually.

Casino and Gaming Night tickets are \$100 per person for CREW members and \$125 per person for non-members.
