Energy Efficiency a Growth Market Commercial real estate lender Self-Help is eyeing Charlotte's green-building market with a new \$15 million **Energy Loan Fund**. The non-profit launched the fund this spring with help from Bank of America and now looks to finance renewable energy and energy efficiency upgrades from \$5,000 to \$10 million. Target sectors include multifamily housing developments, small businesses, child care centers, charter schools and houses of worship. The specialized fund will enable Self-Help to provide an interest rate discount of 1.5 percentage points for qualifying projects. Who you missed:

Carolyn Flowers, CEO of CATS.

Carolyn is a graduate of UCLA, and came to Charlotte in 2010 after serving the City of Los Angeles as the Chief Operating Officer for the Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority.

What you missed:



If you missed our last CREW luncheon, you missed an excellent presentation by Carolyn Flowers as she took us through the various proposed

projects, current projects, and upcoming DNC impact on CATS. Upcoming projects include expanding bus routes, establishing more light rail lines (the establishment of the BlueLine being the most visible investment made), and looking at extending a RedLine into Mooresville and Iredell county (focusing on commuter traffic/mobility).

Due to the economic impact on sales and use tax, CATS has lost five and a half years' worth of projected sales tax growth. They are currently looking at ways to mitigate the gap this leaves in project revenue. Options include applying for state and federal funding and looking closely at public/private partnerships. CATS has seen success in federal funding with the Streetcar Project where a mile and a half is funded through the federal government.

Another interesting aspect of Carolyn's presentation was the ULI Rose Program: where Charlotte has been chosen for the program to review and solve transportation restraints along Independence Blvd. As a hybrid freeway/street, CATS would like to see a light rail along this corridor, however, that poses certain restraints to business and pedestrian traffic. CATS has plans to develop certain sections of Independence Blvd. into a more accessible corridor starting late 2012 or 2013.

Lastly, with the DNC approaching there will be many restraints that CATS will experience due to Federal Safety regulations. The CATS Transportation Center will be subject to move temporarily throughout the DNC's stay in Charlotte. This location could change up to the last minute if Denver offers us any guidance from their experience.

Lessons Learned:

As Charlotte grows, it sees the need for increased mobility along 5 corridors, one of which has been established: Southend. The growth of CATS bus lines is the outcome of the investment we voted for years ago, leading to the CATS being one of the safest bus systems in the country. As CATS continues making more high growth corridors accessible via mass transit, it is due to the vision and hard work by people like Carolyn who believe that you must "persist with confidence" as well as voters who vote for the investment.
