


someone would hand over for it in its newly recovered state. We were the original Sanford and Son. Or daughter, if you will. My son got this gene. He can reduce a discarded motorbike or auto engine into its individual components and reassemble it into an item of performance and beauty.

It was from my father's passion for bringing new life to the discarded that apparently, I found my life's work. Of course, I didn't know it at the time. But life had a plan for me, and those experiences planted within me a deep need to find purpose in an otherwise unglamorous industry.

It wasn't until the early 1990s that I found my industry transforming away from burying everything in the ground to circulating waste materials back into new product. Here in the south, we were well behind the rest of the world - the rest of the country - in fact, with materials recovery and recycling programs. The company I worked for had ventured into cardboard recycling programs for commercial businesses. But in 1991, the Carillon building was completed uptown, and one of their first occupants came from the West Coast demanding a more robust recycling program. With that challenge before me, I channeled my 12-year-old self and launched the first inner-office, multi-materials recycling program in our company, possibly in Charlotte - though I can't substantiate that. The depth of research and energy required to assemble the resources and align the partners we would need to sustain that program took considerable time and energy, but I had found my passion.

I feel as though we've all been tromping around in that dirty, smelly landfill for the last six months. It's a place we'd all like to turn away from, never looking back. There have been challenges. And loss. I'm hard-pressed to say this time has been filled with treasures. But there are possibilities. And hope. The pandemic has taught me to carefully examine every aspect of my life. Some things I've learned from its challenges will cause me to leave behind old patterns of behavior. They have no purpose moving forward. In some cases, I've dusted off an old skill and repurposed it. And I've seen so much of that in our members as well. I've seen grit and determination. Innovation. Heightened empathy. You have risen up from your former pre-pandemic selves into something new. With new purpose.
